Clarity Assessment – Ken ‘Chopper’ Wilson

Marriage Alpha - Joyce Lim-Goh

The focus for this workshop is to help church leaders understand the course's curriculum, and how to launch and run an effective Marriage and Pre-Marriage program based on Alpha Marriage and Pre-Marriage courses. The workshop includes building a support team, creating the experience, program promotion, the course structure and setup, what to and not to do, care for people, and follow up. We will also discuss the approach of using the course as a church family program and as an extension to serve the community.

They met at the University of Western Ontario and served for many years as lay leaders in Singapore while working in the IT sector.
